Club President, Sue Stievo, called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Sue asked if there were any changes or additions to the proposed agenda. No changes or additions were needed and the agenda was closed.

Secretary's Minutes: Hearing no corrections or additions, the Secretary's Minutes of the last meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter.

Membership Report & Guests: Gayle stated the club has a total of 163 members. Two guests tonight have completed membership applications.

Members stepped up to fill in positions; however, a phone tree was set up to contact more individuals to work the show due to the many remaining vacancies.

Bench Tips by Brad Smith

SMALL PARTS CONTAINERS

I'm always on the lookout for small containers to use for holding all those little parts and tools we deal with in making jewelry, especially since I'm always traveling to classes and workshops.

My latest find are some plastic vials about 15 mm in diameter and 75 mm long. Best part is they are free. The vials are used in the doctor's office to draw blood samples. They cannot be used after their expiration date, and are thrown out. On my last doctors visit, I asked the nurse if they had any expired vials. She replied "How many do you want?" and tried to give me 400 of them. (We settled on 200)

The ones I have are called "Vacutainers", but there are probably many other names. They are clear plastic with a rubber stopper and a paper label all ready to write on. I find them really handy for small parts like jump rings, prong settings, small drills, nuts & bolts, faceted stones, and precious metal filings.
TRY A TOOTHPICK

TOOTHPICKS

The round, stronger toothpicks have a multitude of uses on the jewelry bench. I use them for mixing epoxy resin, for applying paste solder, and with Zama for polishing in tight spots. Toothpicks are also handy for holding the stone while stone setting. Just break off the sharp tip, mold a little beeswax over it, and press it onto the table of your stone. www.BradSmith.com

Fool's Gold (Iron Pyrite)

Iron Pyrite is a delight for kids because it reminds them of real gold. It is often found in quartz veins near gold and can be mistaken for such, so that's why it is also called "fool's gold". You can also find it in sedimentary rock, metamorphic rock, in coal beds and in some fossils.

Pyrite is the most common of the sulfide minerals and can make sparks when struck against steel. It is also used in marcasite jewelry, which was popular during the Victorian era. Today it is mined for sulfur dioxide and is used in batteries and radios for conductivity.

A good specimen of pyrite has a cubic crystalline structure and it is a common mineral that is found in abundance around the world.

Lapidary Shop October Meeting Summary

The LHGMS Lapidary Shop Committee held its first meeting on Oct 14 at the library, with 8 members attending.

In addition to discussing the summary in our October newsletter, the members reviewed establishing a sub-organization specifically for the lapidary facilities. This would be organized as an educational non-profit 501c(3) business, requiring applications to the state and federal, articles and bylaws for the business. Also under consideration is adding a retail store for lapidary supply sales.

The LHGMS currently has funds available to use for start-up costs and/or equipment. As more research is completed, these funds may be insufficient and will require fund raisers.

[NOTE: All committee activity will be presented to the LHGMS Board of Directors and membership for approval. Initial set of goals was developed after the meeting with the first 2 printed here.]

- Establish financial projection of income
- Establish financial projection of expenses
- Determine rent or purchase building, if feasible
- Establish scope of business
- Obtain BOD and LHGMS Approval to proceed

GOALS Phase 2

- Create budget draft
- Create business plan
- Secure BOD and LHGMS member approval
- Secure founding members and donations
- Create business through Articles of Incorporation/Bylaws, also including local, state, and federal filings
- Create banking account
- Purchase computer, printer, and software for inventory and accounting.
- Create time line
