GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

February 12, 2016

New Members: 4

Guests present: 7

Club President Hank Smedley called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm.

Flag Salute: Sergeant-at-Arms, Ed Darnell led the club in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Secretary's Minutes: Club President, Hank stated that the minutes for the January general meeting were published in the last edition of the *Rocky Tales* newsletter. Hank asked if there were any corrections/changes needed to the minutes. No changes are needed. The minutes will be accepted.

Treasurer's Report: Vice President, Linda Harley read the treasurer's report of Jan 31, 2016. The Treasurer's Report will be filed for review.

2016 Budget – Vice President, Linda Harley reviewed the proposed 2016 Budget with the membership.

Steve Greel indicated the budget should include an additional \$150 for the *work* to be performed at the Keenan Camp Mine. The budget allows \$125 for 'Claims/Mines' for 'paperwork/mine repairs' but that is not enough to cover both. Hank will visit with Barry Bandaruk (past president) to get an update on the paperwork and needed repairs, and will report back to the membership next month.

The budget also includes \$2500 for 'Lapidary Committee' for lapidary *start-up* costs to consult with a lawyer, a CPA and costs of possible 501c3 reorganization. Hank explained some of the benefits of switching from a 501(c)7 to a 501(c)3 to the membership. After some discussion, a motion was made to approve the budget item. The motion was seconded. A vote was taken and the motion passed.

Membership Report & Guests:

We currently have 84 paid members now.

Audit Report: President Hank Smedley informed the membership of the recent Audit of the club finances. The audit report shows that we are operating as we should be.

Lapidary shop Committee Report: President Hank Smedley discussed the details of the Lapidary Committee Report with the membership. He discussed the proposed creation of a new business entity with a non-profit tax status of 501(c)3 to allow tax deductible donations. Patrick Bell went over the survey results with the membership. Hank asked the members to review the report thoroughly before the next general meeting as we will be voting on the proposal next month. Hank reminded the members that this project will require member participation to be successful.

Old Business: Scholarship Committee – one more person is needed for the committee. Hank asked for volunteers and Steve Bryson agreed to help out on the committee.

Gem Show Chair – We still need a Gem Show Chair. Ed Darnell and Michelle Smedley will be part of the committee so the chairperson will have strong support. Members are encouraged to consider the honor of chairing the Gem Show and doing their part to help support the club.

WINTERFEST BOOTH



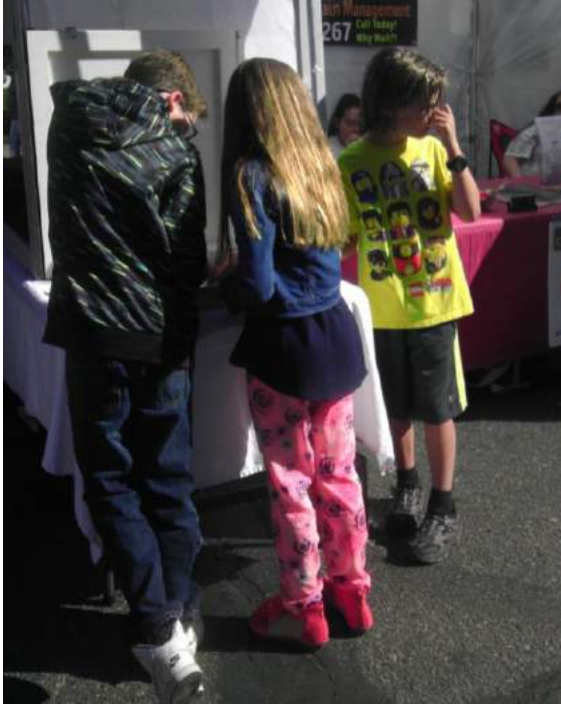

Clear Quartz Crystals, Formula:(SiO₂), from the Feather River, in Plumas County California. These beautiful crystals of clear quartz, are unique to the location. They exhibit the rare quality, having microcrystals, attached to the main crystal faces, giving them a "prickly" appearance.



There will be 9 specimens available for purchase, each labeled and mounted to a clear acrylic base. The price will be \$10, per specimen, and as always, 50% of the proceeds, will go to the club.
